In trade and commerce, sign specialists can work in a workshop, on a building site or as advisors in a craft or industrial company.

Description :

The sign making and signage option of this vocational baccalaureate enables students to know how to make and assemble glass parts used in the composition of signs. The courses cover, in particular, the constraints linked to materials, equipment, techniques, safety instructions, applied physics, the history of the art of glass and management.

Quality and competences :

The AMA vocational baccalaureate in sign making and signage trains professionals capable of adapting to a wide variety of activities in the craft industry (design, manufacture and assembly of parts for signs), or in the trade (purchasing for retailers, distribution, sales).

The student learns the techniques for preparing materials and designing parts: cutting, grinding, gluing, blowing, bending, forming, bending, welding, polishing, painting, wiring, etc.

The courses also cover the various constraints linked to the materials used (plastics, metals, flexible materials, glass, gas, adhesives, electrical equipment), repair-restoration and installation techniques, the history of art, the monitoring of projects, quality control and safety instructions.

Concerned with traditional or innovative techniques, and aware of aesthetics, graduates acquire a good knowledge of the market to which they will be able to adapt.
